Location & Getting Here

Situated approximately 1,500km north of Perth and 35km from the Karijini Visitor Centre, the retreat can be accessed from the Newman and Paraburdoo Airports, or self-drive on a coastal route via Exmouth, Onslow, Karratha or Port Hedland, or an inland route via the towns of Cue and Meekatharra.

Car hire is available from the airport. We recommend 4WD vehicles.

Stand at the top and you'll find yourself awestruck by this powerful creation of nature, where the country has been sculptured and shaped into a labyrinth of plunging chasms.

Whether you are camping or glamping (glamorous camping), the Retreat offers the perfect stay for travellers seeking to blend creature comforts with a rugged encounter in the pristine Karijini National Park, while experiencing a taste of genuine mateship and friendly hospitality.

See & Do

Hike and bushwalk the ancient tracks, journey down to what feels like the centre of the earth and explore the famous gorges, go swimming at the Spa, Handrail, Kermit's, Fern, Rock Arch or Circular Pools, chase waterfalls at Joffre, Fortescue or Hamersley Falls, view the highest lookout in Karijini at Knox Gorge or the Oxer Lookout for a panoramic view of four intersecting gorges.

At dusk, watch a colourful Pilbara sunset slowly merge with an endless blanket of stars that seem to reflect the timelessness of this place. You will be transfixed as the dark night sky reveals the Milky Way.

A stop at the Karijini Visitor Centre is a must do, to see stories of the local Aboriginal culture and heritage, book a tour, or shop for souvenirs.

Karijini National Park

Karijini National Park is located approximately 1,500km north of Perth and around 80km north-east of Tom Price. Karijini is the second largest national park in WA, covering 627,422 hectares, and one of the state's top attractions. The breathtaking, ancient landscape has been carved out by billions of years of erosion, forming deep, plunging gorges, sheer red cliffs, towering waterfalls, sparkling swimming holes and rocky, tree-lined watercourses. It is home to a wide variety of wildflowers and native wildlife.

Karijini Eco Retreat operates within the Karijini National Park, in collaboration with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) and the Traditional Owners, to contribute to the management of the environmental, geographical and cultural values of this world-class park. A portion of your tariff and park entry fee is invested in the conservation of the National Park. Park Passes can be purchased online from www.dbca.wa.gov.au.
