

TRAVEL ITINERARY

The following document provides travellers with information on access throughout Karijini National Park, which aims to support the traveller to make an informed decision on whether the attraction is suitable for their individual needs. ACTIVITY 1 ● **Junction Pool Lookout**

Approx 800m, 30 minutes return

The Junction Pool Lookout showcases views up Hancock Gorge and down to Junction Pool far below. From Oxer Lookout there are unsurpassed views of the junction of Weano, Red, Joffre and Hancock gorges. You can see the tiers of banded iron formation that tower over a pool at the bottom of the gorge. From here, the sheer enormity and grandeur of the gorges is evident.

ACTIVITY 2 ● **Karijini Visitor Centre**

A range of displays take you on a journey of places and people, past and present, through stories of geology, plants, animals and Aboriginal people and their culture. There are access ramps (150cm wide), an accessible toilet, and sufficient room for wheelchair users inside the centre with clearances ranging from 124cm to 183cm.

ACTIVITY 3 ● **Hamersley Gorge Lookout**

Approx 100m, 10 minutes return

A short distance from the carpark, a newly constructed lookout offers views of the gorge for those who don't want to undertake the trail into the gorge. Here you will clearly see how the layers of rock bent and buckled before they pushed their way to the surface millions of years ago.

ACTIVITY 4 ● **Weano Day Use Area**

Weano picnic area has an information shelter, toilets and shaded seating and barbecue facilities and is the base from which to spend a day experiencing this popular section of the park.

ACTIVITY 5 ● **Fortescue Falls Lookout**

Approx 150m, 15 minutes return

From the Fortescue Falls carpark, a 150 metre trail takes to you to the Fortescue Falls viewing area. Fortescue Falls is the only spring-fed waterfall in Karijini National Park. The water cascades down the gently sloped rocks into a pool at the base of Dales Gorge.

ACTIVITY 6 ● **Circular Pool Lookout**

Approx 150m, 15 minutes return

At the Eastern end of Dales Gorge, the Circular Pool lookout can be accessed from the Dales day use area carpark. A short trail from the carpark leads to the lookout, with spectacular views into the gorge and the large amphitheatre of Circular Pool, lined with ferns and trees.

ACTIVITY 7 ● **COMING SOON - Knox Gorge Lookout**

300m, 15 minutes return

A brand new lookout that is being installed overlooking Knox Gorge. The new viewing platform will provide spectacular views down into the gorge and is expected to be open late July 2024.
